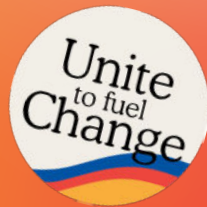

When Union members and our friends and family support Greater Twin Cities United Way, we help make our community work for all of us by providing better access to education, jobs and basic needs.

Union members contribute time, skills and financial gifts. In turn, Greater Twin Cities United Way supports organized labor through funding of Working Partnerships, St. Paul Labor Studies and Resource Center, and Minnesota Teamsters Service Bureau.

Through our partnership with organized labor, we reach directly into workplaces, impacting close to a quarter of a million working families. Our labor partners provide direct services to nearly 13,000 union members annually, including:

- Emergency financial and food help for union members in need
- Free and confidential resources for work-life wellness
- Drug and alcohol recovery services
- Employment services for union members who have lost work
- Job retraining programs and support
- Preparing jobseekers and youth for union jobs and training/apprenticeship programs
- Providing information and referral services
- Civic engagement opportunities
- Community volunteer opportunities for union members and local unions

We need your ongoing support to address areas of need in housing stability, food security, education and economic opportunity.

In one year alone, your support made it possible for:

- 263 individuals to gain industry recognized credentials
- 2,632 individuals to receive job retention, career advancement or career coaching support
- 4,808 individuals to receive financial coaching to help establish a plan for the future
- The Teamsters The Teamsters Food Shelf to distribute 9,000 pounds of fresh milk and produce to 307 families, including teachers who were on strike
- More than 7,000 individuals to receive health and nutrition services through Working Partnerships and St. Paul Labor Studies and Resource Center
- 35 people experiencing homelessness to remove or diminish barriers to stable housing
